## Growing in your faith

Lay Servant Ministries is one of the significant lay leadership development programs available within the United Methodist connection. Through this system of equipping and empowering, Lay servants have the opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ who then go and make other disciples. Lay Servant ministries can be a significant component of any discipleship system providing training in Hospitality, Offer Christ, Purpose and Engagement.



## Becoming a Lay Servant

Classes can be taken in a variety of locations and dates. The Michigan Lay Servant Ministry committee organizes classes to fit needs of participants, specific requests for a topic, and to meet certification requirements. Some classes can be taken online ([beadisciple.com/lay-servant-ministries](http://beadisciple.com/lay-servant-ministries)). BASIC and PREACHING are not offered electronically. (Please check with your district committee as some do not accept online classes or limit the number of online classes.) When an individual takes an online class, it is the responsibility of the individual to provide completion/certification information to the district committee.

Lay servant classes generally fall into the following categories:

- Introduction to Lay Ministry
- Spiritual Gifts
- United Methodist Heritage
- United Methodist Polity
- Leading Worship
- Leading Prayer
- Preaching

Everyone must take a BASIC course before becoming a Certified Lay Servant. Districts post class offerings online with registration information available. Participants may take classes in any location but are responsible to provide their district with proof of completion.

## CERTIFIED LAY SERVANT

The Certified Lay Servant is committed to scripture, the doctrine, heritage, organization and life of The United Methodist Church. They have received specific training to witness to the Christian faith through spoken communication, to lead within a church and community, and to provide caring ministry. A Certified Lay Servant must be a professing member of a local church or charge or baptized participant of a recognized United Methodist collegiate ministry.

To become a Certified Lay Servant, you must:

- Obtain recommendation from the pastor and church council or charge conference in which you hold membership.
- Complete the *Introduction to Lay Servant Ministries: The BASIC Course*.
- Complete an advanced lay servant ministries course.
- Apply to and have qualifications reviewed by the district committee on lay servant ministries.

To maintain Certified Lay Ministry status, you must:

- Submit an annual report and renewal application to the charge conference or church council and to the district committee on lay servant ministries giving evidence of satisfactory performance as a certified lay servant.
- Obtain recommendation for renewal from the pastor and church council or charge conference of the local church or other UM ministry you hold membership.

Complete a lay servant ministries advanced course in the last three years.
